

A new venture

With The Graphic Printing Company's purchase of The News-Gazette and The News Times in May, the concept of People's Choice grew.

'The chance to help'

Adams Physical Therapy has served patients since 1999

Roy Adams started his physical therapy practice with about 1,500 square feet in a building on the north side of Portland.

Over two and a half decades it has moved and grown.

Adams Physical Therapy, which won Best Overall in The Graphic Printing Company's People's Choice voting, now has locations in Portland and Winchester and continues to look for ways to expand its services.

"I didn't want people to feel like they had to leave town to get good care," said Adams, who opened his practice in 1999. "That's one of the things that I've strived throughout to provide. And I think that we provide services that most of the larger communities don't do. ...

"I am passionate about small communities. ... I love my community. These are my friends. These are my neighbors. I feel a very strong connection and dedication to continuing this service."

Born and raised as a preacher's kid moving around south Georgia, Adams moved to Indiana for a job after college and found himself looking for



a new position in 1999 when changes in the medical industry led to cutting staff. He considered other options but felt he might be able to make a better go of it on his own, opening Adams Physical Therapy at 1509 N. Meridian St., Portland. (The site is now home to D'Real Western Wear.) It grew from a 1,500square-foot space to take over the whole building and then moved to its current location at 111 W. North St. in the final days of 2006. In 2017, the business added a second location at 955 E. Washington St. (Indiana 32) in Winchester.

In addition to Adams, the practice includes Bridgette Welker, Lauren Schott and Lexi Waterman, all doctors of physical therapy, and physical therapist Swathi lyer. There are also six physical therapy assistants and an athletic trainer on the staff. The newest addition to the team is Banner, the therapy dog.

Adams Physical Ther-


apy's services include treatment of a variety of pain and sports injuries, as well as rehabilitation from surgery and accidents.

"It's truly getting people back finding their way after they're lost with serious illness or injury," said Adams. "That's the exciting thing. ...

"It's just the challenge, the chance to help ... That's the thing that I really get the most out of."

Shoulder and back pain are two of the most frequent issues the practice sees. (Adams has his own proprietary shoulder rehabilitation program and back rehabilitation protocols, which focus more on core stability and an overall neurophysiological outlook rather than just strength building.) Falls are also high on the list.

To help those who experience falls or otherwise have balance issues, the rehabilitation area is equipped with a rail system that was installed eight years ago. It

works with a harness to prevent patients from falling to the floor.

"This gives our patients with walking difficulties confidence when they're working on things and it also protects our therapists," said Adams. "So we can challenge them."

Other services include neurostimulation, balance testing, orthotics, a highintensity deep tissue laser, a machine that serves as work simulation and a virtual reality system for those who are dealing with dizziness issues. Adams and lyer have started doing dry needling, with both are working on a fellowship in the practice that involves using a needle to stimulate tissues for the man-

agement of pain and other issues.

The practice has also gotten heavily involved with diagnostics — Adams hopes to receive the highest level of board certification in that area this summer — using tools such as an ultrasound to determine the cause of a patient's pain.

Continued from page 7 The practice's Health-track program serves as an additional option for patients. Trainer Carly Hess works with patients to increase muscle and improve function while also providing information on nutritional needs. The cash program is often one used after a patient is discharged from rehabilitation for maintenance or continued improvement.

"Some of our people are utilizing the Health Track to help maintain their function and activity or increase it to be able to do more," said Adams. "And also to lose weight. ... I think that that's a special program."

He added that he feels older folks tend to just deal with pain, assuming it's inevitable with age.

"That's not the case," Adams said. "It's amazing, the body's ability, even as we age ...

"We want to help them get their lives back. We want to help them get their independence back."

While there are no plans to add a third office to the practice, there may be other options for expansion. The practice is considering getting a van to offer mobile services.

There are also plans to ex-

pand in the area of women's health services.

In his mid-60s, Adams has no plans to slow down. And even when that time occurs, he's hopeful the practice have staying power.

"I get up and I'm ready to go," he said. "I look forward. I like seeing the patients. I like seeing them improving. ...

"It's a little different now because it used to be just me. But it's also looking and

watching and helping to guide and grow our staff to continue to meet these needs too. I know one day I'm not going to be here, but I hope Adams Physical Therapy in some form will continue."

Adams Physical Therapy's Portland location is open from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. weekdays. Hours at the Winchester officer are from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.







'It's about the people'

Carvantage has expanded business in Winchester

Carvantage has truly

become a one-stop shop for vehicles.

The business sells cars and services them.

Its partner business, Conn's Collision Center, will take care of things after an accident. It also has a small U-Save rental outlet to fill the gaps.

Carvantage was selected as the "best overall" People's Choice winner for The News-Gazette's readership area as it won the votes for both auto service and repair and car dealership.

"We try to be customercentric," said managing partner Casey Dyer. "It's about the people, man. It's about the customers. Anybody can sell somebody a car one time. But does that person come back? Or do they tell people to come here when they're shopping? Customer care is super important. It's a big deal to us."

Getting into the car business wasn't really a plan for Dyer, a 2008 New Castle High School graduate. But he was offered a job at Sandifar Auto Group by a friend of a friend shortly after high school.

"It's the only thing I've ever done," said Dyer. "I started cleaning cars and transporting cars out of high school and I just never left. ...

"He taught me a ton, taught me the business," he added of Steve Sandifar. "I think I learned a lot."

He progressed through sales, financing and management before buying Sandifar's location in Win-

chester — at that point sales and service were both downtown — along with his in-laws in 2017 and rebranded it as Carvantage.

Conn's was added to the mix a few years ago after Gary Conn had expressed an interest in retiring for several years.

"I was finally like, man, if I don't throw my name in the hat, somebody's going to," said Dyer. "And it's gonna go because it's just always been there. You'd really have to mess something up to not make it go. ...

"I probably wasn't ready to really do it at the time," he added, "but I think the fear of regretting not doing it for me was big enough to say, 'Yeah, let's do it."

The car dealership moved to Symmes Center Drive just north of Conn's about the same time. See **Carvantage** page 31

are about 30 cars on the
lot, Dyer said. Inventory as
of Saturday ranged from a
2014 Chevrolet Malibu
priced at \$9,595 to a 2022
GMC Yukon XL at
\$50,000.

The service center handles items including oil changes, alignments, battery testing/replacement, brakes and tires. (Quotes are available online at thecarvantage.com.)

Conn's takes care of auto body and collision repair, including unibody repairs and painting.

The U-Save rental service currently has about 10 to 15 cars available.

"It's pretty small for now," said Dyer. "But I see a lot of potential for growth in that."

Another area of potential growth for the business is its service center. It has gotten significantly busier over the last couple of years, Dyer said, in part because the dealership is cycling through more vehicles. He said he's unsure how that growth might come — by adding service bays to the downtown location or building a new service center adjacent to the sales center and Conn's.

"I would love to be all under one roof," said Dyer, who now spends most of his time sourcing cars off the street and via auctions. His staff includes Doug Jefferis as the service manager, his son Chase Jefferis who manages the dealership when Dyer is away and Kevin Johnson leading Conn's. "I think for team camaraderie ... I think it's a great place to work. I think it would be even better if we were all together."
