tion and, of course, food to the community.

"The Great Jay County Fair is once again upon us," said Jay County Fair Board president Aaron Loy. "I think things are going really well. A lot of people are excited about the grandstand events.

"A lot of traction toward the truck and tractor pull. It's been several years since we've had that ... so a lot of people are excited to see that come back."

The fair will continue the recent pattern of opening and closing with demolition derbies on the bookend Saturdays — 5 p.m. July 6 and 13. Figure 8 and straw races, which were part of a derby day last year, will have their own grandstand slot 5 p.m. Sunday, with autocross moving to Monday. 3 Bar J Rodeo will be back on Tuesday followed by truck and tractor pulls at 7 p.m. Wednesday and the Cochran and Co. concert for faith night on Thursday.

With Country Concert also taking place next weekend in Fort Loramie, Ohio, the fair board decided to look at different genre options for the big show in Jay County.

They chose Flo Rida. The native of Miami Gardens, Florida, is a rapper, singer and songwriter who has had hits in hip hop, pop and electronic music. He broke onto the scene with the single "Low" — "... Apple Bottom jeans, jeans. Boots with the fur, with the fur ..." — in 2007 and won Teen Choice Awards for breakout artist, rap artist and hook-up the following year. (The hookup award was for "Low," which featured T-Pain.) He also won the International Dance Music Award for best rap/hiphop dance track for "Wild Ones" in 2013.

"We think it's just a great opportunity to mix things up," Loy said. "People always talk about wanting to try something different. ... The fair board kind of got out of their comfort zone to just try something new. People have been asking for something other than country, so we thought with Country Concert being the same weekend this is the year to try something different and see how it does."

Each of the weeknight grandstand events will begin at 7 p.m., with the exception of Flo Rida at 8 p.m.





Reserved grandstand seating, which has been expanded this year, and track are \$45, with pit at \$65 and box seats are \$75. Cochren & Co. — its debut album "Don't Lose Hope" was released in 2021 and it was nominated for the Gospel Music Association's Dove Award for new artist of the year — will highlight Faith Night at the fair.

Tickets are \$20 for grand-


stand, \$25 for box and track and \$30 for pit.

"(It's) appearing to be the biggest one we've had yet," said Loy. "Each year it's gotten bigger and bigger. I think this one will be the best one yet, so we're really excited to see that continue to grow." Tickets range from \$5 to \$20 for the other grandstand events.

Jay County 4-H will stick with the schedule of livestock shows that has become customary the last few years, with the dog and rabbit shows at noon Saturday immediately following opening ceremonies at 11:45 a.m. Small animal supreme showmanship will be at 4 p.m. Tuesday, with large animal supreme showmanship at 5 p.m. Thursday. The awards ceremony and auction will be held at 10 a.m. Friday in the Show Arena.


She is involved in FFA and served on student council. She was also a three-year member of the Patriot girls track team.

She volunteers during the summer at Fort Wayne Children's Zoo.



New 4-H events include Books in the Barn in partnership with Farm Bureau and Jay County Public Library at 10 a.m. Monday and Tuesday. Children approximately ages 3 to 6 are invited to the fairgrounds to hear a story — Monday's will involve chickens while Tuesday's will be about cows — see the animals, participate in some arts and crafts, learn and enjoy a snack. Those in attendance will receive a copy of the book.

Jay County 4-H will also host an event for Mini 4-Hers (kindergarten through second grade) to enjoy some ice cream, compete in a scavenger hunt and meet the Jay County Fair Queen and her court during Kids' Day on Tuesday.

Free entertainment in the Farmer's Building starts with the baby contests Saturday morning and the new Little Miss and Mister Jav County Fair Contest at 1 p.m. Saturday. Other features in the building include an Elvis Presley tribute on Sunday night, Farm Bureau Cook-Off on Monday, a tribute to Johnny Cash on Tuesday, a Veteran's Day program Wednesday, Hunter Riggins in concert Thursday, a George Jones tribute Friday and A Touch of Mexico on Saturday.

Ground entertainment, which is also free, will feature an interactive and educational dinosaur show as well as a barnvard show that features pig racing.

PrimeTime Carnival Company is returning to provide rides and other entertainment for the third consecutive year, though with a trimmed schedule. Rides will open at noon Tuesday for Kids' day and be available through close.

Rides will open at 5 p.m. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. They will then be open from noon to close again Saturday, July 13, for the final day of the fair. (Armbands will be \$25 for Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, and \$30 for Friday and Saturday.)

Loy said the company will bring 20 to 22 rides as it has in each of the last two years.

"We're excited to have Primetime Amusements back," he said. "We've had a great two-year partnership, going into the third year, so we're excited

about that." Admission to the fair will be free until 2 p.m. on the weekends and until 5 p.m. on weekdays.

The admission charges will be \$5 per carload on the opening weekend of the fair. From Monday on, admission is \$5 per person. (Children 5 and younger are admitted free.)
