2024 season

The Tribe kept up the success of the past four seasons, but broke its streak of making it to state as the season ended with a ninth-place finish in the regional meet. The high points of their season came in the Mercer County Invite, in which they placed second and the Tour de Sewer (third). The Tribe placed seventh out of 20 teams in the district meet to advance to the regional before bowing out. Fort Recovery finished sixth out of nine teams at the Midwest Athletic Conference Championships. Joelle Kaup had the highest finish in the conference as her time of 20 minutes, 27.55 seconds, netted her 12th.



Meets to watch Tuesday, Aug. 19, at Mercer County Invite

The Mercer County Invite always provides the Tribe with an opportunity to see how the two teams will fare against multiple MAC opponents right out of the gate.

Saturday, Oct. 11, at MAC Championships

The MAC Championships is a final look at FRHS before it heads south to the district tournament. It pits the Indians against top teams like Minster for a final regular-season challenge.

Fast facts

•The Tribe has had representation at the state tournament as recently as 2023, when the girls team made the trip and placed 10th, while Trevor Heitkamp competed for the boys.

•.This will be Christy Diller's seventh year at the helm of the Indians. She was inducted into Fort Recovery's Hall of Fame in 2018 for her time coaching and competing in cross country and track.

2024 season

Fort Recovery's boys cross country team took a slight step backward following the graduation of Trevor Heitkamp, but an influx of freshmen helped to pick up the slack. The Tribe's best finish came at the Tour de Sewer, where they placed 10th out of 13 competing teams. They ended up finishing in ninth at the Midwest Athletic Conference Championships, only beating New Knoxville by 41 points. Reese Diller was the only runner to crack the top-50 as he finished 26th in 17 minutes, 51.97 seconds. The Indians' season came to a close as a team at the district, where they placed 17th out of 23 teams. Diller advanced to the regional as an individual, where he earned 57th with a time of 18:14.85.

Coach Christy Diller says

"A lot of potential. We've got three freshmen coming up that will absolutely vie for spots on varsity and we bring back four members of varsity. It'll be interesting to see who ends up (in the top seven) and I think that'll change every single week. We bring back Reese Diller, who was our top runner last year and Alex Roessner is right there with him this year. So that'll be nice and we'll have a tighter spread for our top five this year, which should help us team-wise. Our goal is to hopefully qualify a team to regional."

2024 season

The Tribe won the first game of the season against Wayne Trace before going on a seven-game skid. Fort Recovery picked up its second win of the season, and first in the Midwest Athletic Conference, by taking down Parkway 36-24 in week eight. It dropped two more games to finish the regular season, but snuck its way into the playoffs before falling to eventual state champion Marion Local. The Indians finished with a 2-10 record to close out Brent Niekamp's 21-year career.

Coach Wes Wenning says

"What we want to establish is a culture of love. That's love for this community, love for the game of football and love for that guy that you're lining up with that's to your left and to your right. If we can establish that culture, we're off to a tremendous start in this era. We're laying down the foundation of everything we're looking forward to establishing in these next few years. We've just reiterated it with the guys, it's all about love and those three pillars."

Matches to watch Friday, Aug. 22, vs. Ponitz

Pontiz will ring in a new era of Fort Recovery football as Wes Wenning takes over at the helm. Along with it being the first look at a new group of Indians, it is a big game for potential playoff implications.

Friday, Sept. 26, vs. New Bremen

The Tribe had its closest finish of the season against New Bremen, but fell short 14-12. Despite being ranked fifth in Division VI, the Cardinals only came out on top due to a pair of failed 2-point attempts.

Friday, Oct. 10, at Parkway

The Indians' sole win in the Midwest Athletic Conference came against the Panthers last year. If they want to climb in the MAC, they'll need to take care of business at PHS.



- •This will be Wes Wenning's first year as the Indians' head coach after taking over for Brent Niekamp. Wenning was coached by Niekamp and a part of the 2015 team that won the Division VII state title. Niekamp finished with a record of 81-137.
- •Fort Recovery's roster is 48 players deep and the largest it's been since the 2020 season. Thirteen of those players are upperclassmen who didn't play last season, including six who did compete in 2023.
- •The Indians have made eight playoff appearances, winning at least one game in five of those years. All of Fort Recovery's playoff losses have come against Midwest Athletic Conference rivals.

2024 season

The move to the Southwest District treated the Indians well in 2024 as they made it to the regional semifinal match for the fourth time and the first since 2020 by rolling through Yellow Springs and Twin Valley South in the sectional and topping host Arcanum and Miami Valley Christian Academy in the district. The Tribe's season came to an end at the hands of Anna as it fell 25-19, 25-18, 22-25, 25-22 in the regional opener. Fort Recovery started off the season hot as it claimed six of its first nine contests before suffering a five-match skid just prior to the postseason run. FRHS finished with a 13-14 record and placed eighth in the Midwest Athletic Conference at 2-7.

Fast facts

•The Tribe made its fourth regional appearance last year, but fell short of advancing to its first regional semifinal since 1991. Guggenbiller has been the coach for the last two regional appearances.

•This will be Guggenbiller's sixth year at the helm of the Indians. He is 73-52 (24-21 Midwest Athletic Conference) with the best finish in the MAC coming in 2020 (second).

•Fort Recovery will have a sizable change to its back row after graduating both of its setters from 2024 and Kenna Dues making a position change from libero to outside hitter.

Coach Travis Guggenbiller says

"We're looking at our growth this year. We're going to take it one day at a time. We're going to learn to grow as a team. We don't have any seniors on the team, so it's all about learning each other, working together with each other, figuring out what works, areas of improvement and just learning the game. Our focus is in the post-season. We want to have another successful postseason, so we're going to take it day-by-day. We want to compete within our league and have a good record overall, but it's about learning each and every day. About getting 1% better every day."
