We tried something new.

In mid-January, we announced some changes coming to our special section schedule. One of those — People's Choice — is in your hands as you read these words.

The idea was relatively simple:

(Some businesses that would fit in those categories got votes in our "other" category this year. It was our intention that "other" would be a catch-all and maybe give us some ideas going forward, so it worked out well.)

The advertiser response to this section has been overwhelming. When we discussed the idea, we didn't know if we'd end up with an 8-page section or maybe a 12. What we ended up with was 28 pages, made possible by advertisers getting involved to promote their businesses.

We thank you.

So, what happens next?

Our new offerings of special sections will continue throughout the year. The next one on our list is Teacher Appreciation, which is scheduled for April. Keep an eye out for information regarding how to nominate your favorite teacher.

As a result of People's Choice, we have created a badge that all of your winners can use in their advertising throughout the year.

'We try our best'

Ja-Mar is under third generation of family leadership

Shauna Runkle responded modestly when she heard Ja-Mar TV, Appliance & Bedding, the business she co-owns with her husband, Jim, received the most overall votes in The Commercial Review's People's Choice balloting.

"We try our best," she said with a smile.

That's something her family has been doing for three generations.

Her maternal grandparents, Jack and Mariana Payne, opened the business in 1970 on Meridian Street. ("Ja-Mar" comes from the first letters of each of their names.) In 1983, Runkle's parents, Troy and Kris Rose, took over and moved the store to its current location on Votaw Street. The Runkles' full-time involvement in the business began in 2000.

If that sounds like smooth sailing, it wasn't.

The company — and the family — underwent a number of challenges over that time. They made it through with the help of each other and the community. And with hard work and a strong foundation.

When they started Ja-Mar, the Paynes already had years of business experience. A 1986 retrospective of their careers in The Commercial Review described how at the age of 12 Jack began working at Mariana's parents' company, Willman's Bakery. The Redkey bakery once em-

ployed as many as 135 people and delivered bread throughout the region. Jack became manager in 1942, always working alongside Mariana. They married in 1937. In 1952, they joined with Dick Norman to open D&J Appliances in Portland. When it closed, Jack was a traveling salesman for a few years before he and Mariana opened Ja-Mar.

Jack was in charge of sales

and Mariana took care of the books. Granddaughter Shauna was just a year old.

Then in 1971, one year after Ja-Mar opened, fire broke out at the nearby Beals Restaurant. Water and smoke damage forced the Paynes to relocate the store overnight.

"Because we had a lot of good help, we were able to open up the very next day," Jack said in the 1986 article.

Continued from page 5 Fire struck the business again in 2000, causing considerable damage. Then in 2018, high winds accompanying the tornado that hit Jay County ripped the roof from Ja-Mar's warehouse next door to the

Runkle remembered that day in a February 2019 article in Your Source, the trade magazine for BrandSource buying group. She and a part-time employee were in the store when they got a call about the roof. They stepped out the front door to see it spread over the grass and covering three cars in the parking lot.

Then it started to rain. Runkle and the employee began moving inventory from the warehouse into the showroom on handcarts. After a few minutes, they had help.

"People just showed up," she told the magazine. "I bet I ended up with 30 people - people who just stopped by and helped us move stuff."

It took just two hours to get everything into the showroom.

The single biggest

challenge the business has faced over its 52 years was the sudden death of the Payne's daughter and Runkle's mother, Kris Rose.

"She just went into the bathroom and never came out," Runkle said.

It was an aneurysm. Runkle and her husband had moved from Indianapolis in 1998. She was working parttime at the store and had two young children at home when her mother died. Although she had grown up in the business and helped her grandmother keep the books since she was in junior high, Runkle had never imagined taking over.

Her father's reaction to his wife's death changed her mind.

"My dad literally looked at me and said, 'If you don't come back in here full-time, I'm closing shop. I can't do this by myself," she said last week.

That job still fills Runkle's days, though she has taken some time off over the past few weeks to recover from rotator cuff surgery. Cindy Denney, one of the store's three part-time employees, has been filling in. Jim Runkle also works full-time with delivery and installation duties. Troy Rose, now remarried and living in Union City, stops by one or two days a week.

"He enjoys coming back and talking to people he hasn't seen in a while," Runkle said.

It seems to be a satis-

Ja-Mar will do repairs on appliances purchased from big box stores, but serves its own customers first.

"We have to prioritize," she said, not only in terms of where the appliance was purchased but also in terms of the urgency of the required repair. "You're not going to get that from (a big box store)."

Runkle considers those stores to be Ja-Mar's competition, not other local stores like Strohl Appliance & Electronics or Liggett TV & Maytag Home Appliance Center.

"I want all of us to stay in business," she said.

If a customer comes in looking for a brand Ja-Mar doesn't carry but another local store does, she will happily

refer them to the other store.

"I don't want (the customer) to go to Muncie," she said. "If we can keep them here, keep them local and keep them buying from any of us, that's better. It's better for everybody."

That's one way the Ja-Mar family supports the community that has supported them through the vears.

They also established the Kris Rose Memorial Wonder Woman Scholarship through The Portland Foundation in 2001.

"My mom just did so much," Runkle said. "We always called her Wonder Woman."

The scholarship supports female Jay County High School graduates planning to study busi-
